



## The CEVNI test

### Technical requirements

Please make sure you are familiar with these and pass the information on to your potential customers so they can check the compatibility of their own device and software before buying the course.

### Course materials

There is no compulsory course pack or book for the CEVNI test, but learners would find it useful to study the RYA European Waterways Regulations (order code G17).

### Instructor support

The centre's nominated CEVNI instructor must be available to respond to requests for help within eight working hours.

Each day you will receive a summary of tests that your learners have completed along with the scores, which will help you spot if anyone is struggling and allow you to proactively get in touch to offer help. The learner can also ask for help by emailing via the 'Contact your instructor' link in the test. How you give instructional support is up to you and the learner to decide – it may be by phone, email, skype etc or you may arrange for them to come to your centre for some face-to-face tuition. However it is delivered, a reasonable amount of support must be provided within the test fee.

To provide support specific to the areas in which the learner is struggling, the instructor can review the learner's test. See 'Reviewing assessments' for details of how to do this.

### The test

No tuition is included in the online CEVNI test. Centres wishing to offer tuition leading up to the test may do so, but it must be clear that it is not an RYA course and is a separate entity to the test.

The test is split into two sections: 'Signs and buoyage' and 'Sound signals, lights and shapes'. There are 15 questions in each part and the learner must score 11 or more in each part to pass the test. The time limit for 'Signs and buoyage' is six minutes, and the time limit for 'Sound signals, lights and shapes' is nine minutes.

Two attempts are allowed for each part of the test. If a learner doesn't pass after the second attempt they are advised to seek help from their training centre or spend more time studying the handbook. When the centre is happy that the learner is ready for another two attempts they can request a reset from [interactive@rya.org.uk](mailto:interactive@rya.org.uk). Please include in the email your centre's name, the learner's name and which part needs resetting.

### **Certification**

On successful completion of both parts of the test, the learner can download a certificate from their course. This certificate must be submitted with the ICC application form if they are applying for an International Certificate of Competence.
